A letter from Père-Lachaise Cemetery to the James Monroe Museum indicating the poor condition of Eliza's grave led Kathryn Willis on a crusade to clean it; however, it's condition was dire. Research into Eliza's circumstances at the time of her death indicated she intended to return home from her 1838 trip, but poverty and illness precluded travel, and she died in Paris on January 27, 1840.

If her grave is in danger of being obliterated by Père-Lachaise due to lack of maintenance, and she intended to return to America, WE SHOULD BRING HER HOME!
